

## USI.5a Factors leading to the colonization of America

Teacher Tips: You will need one 8 ½" x 11" sheet of colorful paper.

1. Make a shutter fold booklet. (fold as in hamburger fold, pinching but not creasing the center, just to mark the center. Fold both sides into the center, like a shutter).
2. Fold the shutter in half, hamburger fold, to make a crease. Open this crease and cut along the inside folds so that the shutter now has four doors to open.
3. Glue the 4 colony titles on the top of the shutter, two on each side.
4. Inside, either have students write descriptions about why each colony was established, or use the description rectangles below and glue them inside.
5. Students may add drawings or icons a memory devices or for additional meaning.
