Teacher Tips:

1. Make an according booklet:
2. First fold the paper in $\frac{1}{2}$, hot dog fold, and cut along the fold making 2 pieces.
3. Fold each piece in half, hamburger fold, leaving a $\frac{1}{2}$ inch tab.
4. Then fold the paper up again to the tab, creating 4 sections and a tab.
5. Fold the tab forward and then back the opposite way.
6. Re-crease each fold alternating back and forth, to create an accordion fold.
7. Glue the tab from one piece to the end section of other piece of paper to make one continuous accordion with eight sections.
8. Have students create a drawing to represent the meaning in each rectangle section with a typed message. Color if desired.
9. Cut out the drawing rectangles.
10. Glue the title as a cover on the front section of the folded accordion.
11. Glue each of the other rectangles in one section of the accordion.
